THE MARY KAWENA PUKU'I AWARD

In keeping with the West Honolulu Rotary Club's long tradition of recognizing and supporting our Hawaiian culture, on this our club's 50th anniversary, we have established a new award to honor a non-Hawaiian person who has made a significant contribution to our Hawaiian community through their chosen vocation or field of endeavor.

The award is named after Mary Kawena Puku'i, the highly respected authority on Hawaiian language and culture. Much of her life was dedicated to the sharing of her knowledge with the people of Hawaii in the true spirit of Aloha.

Patience Elmay Namakauahoaokawena'ulaokalaniikiikilaninui Wiggins Bacon

Pat Bacon was born on Waimea, Kauai on February 10, 1920 and was adopted by Mary Kawena Puku'i when she was just eight weeks old. Known to many as "Aunty Pat" she has been deeply immersed in Hawaiian culture since childhood

At an early age she began studying traditional hula from her Mother and practitioners like Joseph Ilala'ole, Keahi Luahine, the grand-aunt and adoptive mother of 'Iolani (Makekau) Luahine and "Kapua", cousin of Keahi Luahine.

Pat Bacon is a Kumu Hula and her workshop in Hula Kahiko (ancient hula) has been presented in Mexico City, San Francisco, Japan, Okinawa and Hawaii.

Other Kumus have come from as far as Florida, Colorado, Canada and Samoa to learn from her. She has shared and continues to share her deep knowledge of things Hawaiian with the people of Hawaii.

She has been employed by the Bishop Museum for over 50 years and continues as the Cultural Resources Specialist at the Museum archives where she catalogues chants and other Hawaiian materials.

Aunty Pat has served as a judge at the Merry Monarch Festival since 1988, the King Kamehameha Hula Festival, the Keiki Hula Competition, the Hula Competition in Mexico since 1992, the Hawaii Secondary School Hula Kahiko Competition and the King Kamehameha and Merry Monarch Festival in Japan.

She was married to George Bacon and has one daughter, Mary Kawena Bacon Browne.
